Program Fact Sheet

1. What is the SAIL Program?

A program to encourage architects, contractors, subcontractors, and other members of the project team to involve CCC students in their project work:

- Internships
- Mentorships
- Job shadowing

- Cooperative Work Experience
- Presentations
- Site walks

2. Minimum student workforce participation goal of 1,000 hours for the bond projects.

3. The purpose of the SAIL Program:

- To involve students in construction and professional services contract work on the bond projects;
- For students to gain hands-on experience to develop their skillsets and improve their employability;
- To foster and build connections with business and industry.

4. Why should I participate?

Businesses that make efforts to meet CCC's student workforce goal will be recognized in CCC's quarterly Bond Projects Newsletter, on the Bond Information Webpage, and on CCC's various social media channels. The Bond Projects Quarterly Newsletter is distributed to:
