

- **Service area:** Serves the majority of Clackamas County, 378,000 people
- **Annual full-time tuition:** \$4,860
- **Financial aid disbursed:** \$10,066,850
- **Budget:** Operating budget of \$62.5 million, grants and contracts of \$12 million, and proprietary budgets of \$2.5 million
- **State funding:** 30% of operating budget
- **Foundation:** Assets of \$20 million, including endowments of \$16 million
- **History & accreditation:** Founded in 1966, accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities

## EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

- **Career technical:** CCC offers 108 one-year certification of completion and/or two-year associate of applied science degree programs
- **College transfer:** CCC offers two-year Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees that lead to transfer
- **Literacy/basic skills:** CCC offers individualized instruction in basic academic and study skills, including Adult High School Diploma, GED, ESL, alternative schools and Life and Career Options
- **Community education:** CCC offers noncredit personal interest and enrichment courses throughout the county
- **Business training:** CCC offers contracted employee training through the Customized Training and Development Services program and assistance to small businesses through the Small Business Development program

- **Transfers:** 14.60% of fall 2016 cohort students transferred by the end of their first two years to another institution.
- **Matriculates:** 21% of high school graduates (2017) attend CCC within 16 months of graduation
- **Financial aid:** 2,287 students received grant or scholarship aid
- **PELL grants:** 2,054 students received PELL grants
- **Added income to Clackamas County economy:** \$291.7 million in FY 2018-19, a value approximately equal to 1.3% of the county's total gross regional product (GRP)
