

Step One of Registration: Planning your Classes

1. Go to my.clackamas.edu.
2. Log-in using your CCC user log-in name and password.
*If you do not know this, please contact registration@clackamas.edu or call 503-594-6074.
3. On the left hand side, select “Self Service” and then “Self Service: Student.”

6. Select “Go to My Progress” (typically on the left hand side).

7. Scroll down to see the different requirements for your degree/certificate. If you want to take a course for a specific requirement, select the specific “search” button in that specific section to find all the classes that will meet that requirement. See image below for an example. If you select the blue circled button, it will search for all the Writing classes that will fulfill this Writing requirement. If you select the red circled button, it will search for all the Communication classes that will fulfill this Communication requirement.
